

## Coronavirus and Students Survey: Wales Results

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## Project overview

#### **Objectives**

NUS Insight conducted a survey alongside One Voice Digital who run the TOTUM product for students, and NUS member students' unions to understand more about how students feel about the current Coronavirus (Covid-19) pandemic.

## **Explanation of weighting**

For Wales we achieved an original sample of **336** students. We have weighted the data to reflect the student population of Wales resulting in **339** responses.

#### Methodology

A sample of **9872** was achieved overall and in Wales we achieved **339** responses.

Respondents were given a chance to win £500 to encourage response.

The survey was promoted via the NUS Student database, the TOTUM database, through social media & via NUS' member unions at the end of March 2020.

The survey took 20 **minutes** to complete & was in field from Friday 27<sup>th</sup> March until Monday 6<sup>th</sup> April.




## Health, wellbeing and welfare



Three in five students in Wales are scared to some extent about getting Covid-19.

#### Feelings towards contracting the Coronavirus (Covid-19)



Two thirds of students in Wales claim to feel 'somewhat' or 'fairly' prepared to manage any health conditions they have should they contract Covid-19.


## Preparedness to manage health conditions if contract Coronavirus (Covid-19)

Only 15% of disabled students have been asked to confirm or declare any impairments that may relate specifically to Covid-19 and their ability to study.


#### **Declaration of any impairments**





The majority of students in Wales have practiced social distancing. Avoiding crowded places and avoiding seeing family and friends are other common measures. Two in three have avoided going to University/College.

## Measures taken in the past 2 weeks specifically to protect yourself from the Coronavirus (Covid-19)



Encouragingly almost two thirds of students are aware to some extent of the public health guidance on living in shared accommodation in relation to Covid-19. And over one in three claim to be 'very' or 'extremely' aware.


## Awareness of the public health guidance on living in shared accommodation in relation to the Coronavirus (Covid-19)

Almost one in four Welsh students say that Covid-19 has had a very negative impact on their family life; over half say it has had a somewhat negative impact.


#### Impact of Coronavirus (Covid-19) on family life

#### Impact of Coronavirus (Covid-19) on friends and social life




#### How students are staying in touch with friends and family



# Support received from institutions about Coronavirus (Covid-19)



On the whole students agree that their institution has provided up to date news/developments, helpful support and practical advice on what action to take.

#### **Agreement with statements**



Where students disagreed that their institution kept them up to date with the latest news/developments this was largely down not receiving any. A third said the information they had received was late or out of date.

## Reasons for <u>disagreement</u> that institution has kept you up to date with latest news and developments



Where students disagreed that their institution had provided them with practical advice on what action to take, this was largely down to simply not having received any information at all, or receiving out of date information.

## Reasons for <u>disagreement</u> that institution has provided you with practical advice on what action you should personally take



Almost a third of students in Wales have already volunteered to help those within the community who are vulnerable or who may self isolating since the outbreak of Covid-19.


## Volunteered within community to help those who are more vulnerable or those who may be self isolating since the outbreak of Coronavirus (Covid-19)

## Agreement that people at your institution are adhering to the Government advice and guidance on social distancing and self isolation






# Education: teaching and learning experience and academic success



Almost eight in 10 agree that their institution has provided online learning required as a result of the Covid-19 crisis and almost three quarters are confident that their institution is managing the crisis well. Two thirds are concerned about the effect of Covid-19 on their final degree/course qualification



Of the students in Wales who have had online learning provided by their institution, over four fifths agree that they are able to access the online learning sufficiently to complete their studies and almost three quarters agree the online provision is a good standard/quality.

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
D2. You mentioned that your institution has provided online learning in response to the Coronavirus (Covid-19). How far do you agree with the following statements?

A fifth of students in Wales have a placement as part of their course. Of these the majority believe the current Covid-19 outbreak will have a negative impact on their ability to complete their placement.

## Impact you think Coronavirus (Covid-19) will have on your ability to complete your placement

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

Just over a quarter of students studying in Wales have a vocational component to their course. Of these, over three quarters believe the Covid-19 outbreak will have a negative impact on the vocational element of their course.

## Impact you think Coronavirus (Covid-19) will have on the vocational element of your course





Of those who receive learning support from their institution, just over two thirds feel they have received adequate support to enable them to continue their work to the best of their ability throughout the Covid-19 pandemic.

## Agreement that you have received adequate support from your institution to enable best ability



Only 3% have themselves or known of someone who has been disciplined for nonattendance as an attempt to minimise social interaction since the covid-19 outbreak.


#### Have you, or anyone you know been disciplined for nonattendance as an attempt to minimise social interaction since the outbreak of Coronavirus (Covid-19)?



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Health is the number 1 priority during the Covid-19 outbreak for students in Wales. Finances was most likely to be ranked the 2<sup>nd</sup> most important concern, followed by personal relationships, education, housing, and then Visa status (which is only relevant for certain international students)

### Ranking of importance for yourself during the Coronavirus (Covid-19) outbreak







## Income and Financial Circumstances



Two in five students are in either full or part time employment. Almost one in ten have a zero hours contract.

#### Job(s) held alongside studies



Of those students who currently work, a third have been asked to work from home, while 16% have been furloughed. One in 10 have been made to take unpaid leave.


#### How work has been affected by Coronavirus (Covid-19)





Almost half of students in Wales say that the income of someone who supports them financially has been impacted by Covid-19.


## Has the income of someone who helps support you financially been impacted by Coronavirus (Covid-19)?





Over three quarters of students are concerned about their ability to manage financially during the Covid-19 outbreak. Just over a quarter are 'extremely' or 'very' concerned


#### Concern about ability to manage financially during outbreak





Three quarters of students in Wales have cut back on luxury/non-essential items since the Covid-19 outbreak. A third have also cut back on food expenditure and around a fifth have cut back on utilities.

#### Cutting back in terms of spending since Coronavirus (Covid-19) outbreak






## Accommodation



A quarter of students who are living in privately rented accommodation/owned halls of residence say there is some likelihood that they will need to stay in their current property beyond the original planned contract date.


### Likelihood of remaining in current property beyond original planned contract data

## Level of concern about financial impact of Coronavirus (Covid-19) on ability to pay rent




# Level of concern about financial impact of Coronavirus (Covid-19) on ability to pay bills

### Have you spoken to your landlord about these issues?





Encouragingly the majority of students in private rented accommodation/owned halls of residence have not been issued with an eviction notice.

## Have you been issued with an eviction notice?



A quarter of students would like to be released early from their rental obligations. The main reason given for this preference is the fact that learning has now moved online.


# Preference for being released from rental early?

# Why do you want to be released from your contract?







# Consumption/Goods and Purchases




A quarter of students studying in Wales say they have purchased something more than usual. In the main this has related to long life groceries. Soap and pain relief items are also a common purchase




# Government actions




Around a guarter of students in Wales believe the UK government has adequately considered the difficulties of students at this time, while two in five believe the government is acting in the best interests of students




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H1. Please tell us how far you agree, if at all, with the statements below in relation to the Coronavirus (Covid-19) pandemic?





### Other information/guidance would like from governments



### **Awareness of Government measures to combat economic impacts**






# Self isolating/your health/movement restrictions

### What are you currently doing/plan to do to support your well being?








# The future

Students are concerned about the impact of the virus on so many aspects their studies and student life. These are just the main areas highlighted

### **Key themes:**

- Ultimate grades / predicting grades
- Lack of time to prepare / meeting deadlines
- Having to work / submit online
- Lack of motivation / focus / concentration
- Impact on stress and health

"That my assessment grade will drop due to the stress and worry I'm experiencing. I find it extremely hard to concentrate on my work."


"with online study and no fixed timetabled routine. hard to find motivation and the little motivation is overcome with worry and stress about degree result. I wont do as well."

"Exams would have to be online or changed into assessments which imply more work and less time. We only have access to information uploaded online, not to online lectures, therefore learning is going to be harder."

# Confidence that next year of study enrolment will take place in person on campus



### When expect to return to studying?



# Expectation that when you return to studying it will be 'business as usual'



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








# Usual term time living circumstances before the Coronavirus (Covid-19) outbreak




# Disability, impairment or long term health condition






# Does your gender identity match the gender you were assigned at birth?


### Sexual orientation/preference






