As a result of a poor HE funding system, smaller or specialist institutions with fewer income streams will often pass many additional costs on top of tuition fees onto the student, and officers continuously struggle to fight against this. However, not only do I believe the current HE structure is broken, I believe how NUS reaches smaller institutions is broken also. Small does not mean irrelevant and I want to be part of the solution to represent, hear and speak for the less political, quieter unions. I want to help create a culture to empower my students that change is achievable no matter where you come from.

In the long term, it may mean that SUs only put resources into the activity that the NSS measures, to the detriment to everything else and the student experience. How do we tackle this?

NUS should launch its own survey – the Students' Union Satisfaction Survey (SUSS). SUSS will include excellent questions that accurately suss out how SUs enhance student life, illustrating how inadequate the NSS is at this. However, the general election showed us that free education is not only a popular demand, but within our reach. Hi, I'm Adam, the Education Officer at the University Of Birmingham Guild Of Students. In the last year, at Birmingham, we have been looking at how we make our university and students' union environment more inclusive, to fully represent the diversity of our students and ensure that everyone is able to access and enjoy the university experience. This has included looking at the BME attainment gap, disability access and inclusivity of under-engaged groups, such as international students and postgrads. With the introduction of our full-time Postgraduate Officer, PGs have been a particular focus this year. More students than ever are opting for postgraduate study because of the increasing difficulties in the graduate employment market, the availability of postgraduate loans and the resignation that we're already in so much debt, so what's one more year? Student unions across the country are increasing postgraduate representation to reflect this but nationally, we are going backwards. Postgrad section is increasingly underfunded, its committee hasn't existed for two years after being removed with no consultation, and PG policy is consistently not followed.

There is a lot going on in HE at the moment, but we shouldn't continue to disregard nearly a quarter of our students. If elected, I will ensure that postgraduate voices – and all of the voices that we are currently ignoring – are prioritised this year.

NUS has the resources to do this; we need a more coherent plan to turn our aims into a reality.

In my time as Education Officer, I have pushed for the academic system to be viewed more holistically. Education shouldn't just be about getting the degree, it's about how the knowledge gained equips you for the world beyond university and how it should make you a more well rounded person. The university has so far agreed to diversify assessment methods and rely less on exams as well as accepting the need for a wholesale review of the personal tutoring system which is too academically focused and includes little pastoral support. I am also lobbying the university to extend the opening hours of one of our libraries to 24 hours in line with students' needs.

NUS has to support its constituent members in the strongest way possible. If elected onto the HE Zones Committee, I will push for more training and assistance to Education Officers nationwide. If at the grassroots level we're struggling, then how are we going to succeed nationally? I'll also ensure that our work is more liberation and sections focused and that we emphasise the need to work to reduce the BME attainment gap and lobby for a liberated curriculum.
