Better links between local health services and students so that you can access support outside of term time or away from college or university and for a better-connected sector, working together to overcome poor mental health in students.

More work to make it easier to access the support you need in your chosen language.

A campaign for a student-designed baseline level of support, so that more students know their rights and are able to hold their colleges and universities to account when things go wrong.

### **Brexit**

The UK's decision to leave the EU in 2016 poses significant levels of risk for students in Wales. We risk losing world-renowned academic staff and study-abroad opportunities, while seeing growing levels of intolerance and hate crime within our communities by an emboldened far-right extremist movement.

A Wales-wide campaign for a People's Vote on any final Brexit deal. This gives the two million young people unable to vote in 2016 have the chance to have their voices heard on politics that will affect them the most, for the longest period of time.

Concrete promises and guarantees from the Welsh and UK governments that student opportunities will be protected, no matter the exit scenario.

A continued fight against the violence and discrimination faced by minority groups and protected characteristics in our colleges, on our campuses and in our communities; because Wales should always be a warm and welcoming society, no matter your gender, ethnicity or sexuality.

Produce accessible and engaging advice and guidance for students and Students' Unions on the issue of accommodation and housing, helping to signpost students to support and raising awareness of students' rights when it comes to housing. Create a nationwide and student-led working group on housing, to keep real-time communication channels open and make sure the campaign is delivering for you and your members.
