When students vote we'll be voting for parties who commit to and candidates who endorse seven essential policies; those who will:

- 1 Hold a People's Vote on any Brexit deal agreed by the UK Parliament
- 2 Guarantee EU funding which supports access to further education will be replaced in the event of Brexit
- 3 Guarantee EU funding which supported research in higher education will be replaced in the event of Brexit
- Protect inward and outward student mobility post-Brexit, including participation in Erasmus+ or any successor schemes and cross-border study on the island of Ireland
- 6 Create a fair immigration system for all migrants including international students, with an expedited legal guarantee of a post-study work visa lasting at least two years for international students

- 7 Secure medical supplies from the risk of a no deal Brexit

For students to thrive in their education they must be able to live and work in a healthy society. They must be able to access support for mental or physical health needs. They have a right to safe and affordable housing. They need to have their voices represented and not be faced with unfair constraints when voting. And as a society we have to address the climate crisis to safeguard our future.

The election is an opportunity to send a key message on these basic rights, not only for the benefit of students but of society as a whole. NUS wants parties standing in this election to commit to seven policies, and we encourage all students and young people to consider voting for parties and candidates who endorse them. It is also very important for all parties to recognise the effects of their decisions on Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland, even in areas where policy is devolved.

When students vote we want:

- 1 Invest in the NHS to address the mental health crisis
- 2 Tackle the spiralling costs of student accommodation and ensure rooms are accessible to all students
- 3 Ensure all those in post-16 education can access healthcare from an end to prescription charges on apprentices to abolishing the health surcharge levied on international students across the UK
- 4 Invest in healthcare students to ensure the future of the NHS workforce
- 5 Extend the provision of transition related healthcare services across the UK
- 6 Protect the integrity of our democracy and ensure that politics is accessible to all students
- 7 Take urgent action on the climate crisis
