Session outlines - staff stream

10:15 Supporting officers in small SUs

Supporting officers in a small SU can be really rewarding but also comes with unique demands. With fewer staff, overlapping responsibilities, and short officer terms, the relationship between staff and officers has a lot to balance. In this session, we'll look at the realities of officer support in small SUs, share practical mentoring approaches, and think about what helps officers to grow, thrive, and lead confidently (without exhausting your limited capacity!

11:15 Effective learner voice in small SUs

In small SUs, learner voice often depends less on formal structures and more on the relationships you build, the credibility you develop, and creative solutions. In this session, we'll map and understand the ecosystem of learner voice and influence, from course reps and committees to conversations in corridors. We'll explore how to strengthen the SU's influence, making impact visible, and designing approaches that work with limited time and resources.

13:00 Elections in small SUs

Running elections in a small SU often feels like a mix of having limited resources and lots of pressure to stay compliant but keep things engaging. In this session, we'll run through our experiences of supporting elections in small SUs, helping you to keep things free and fair whilst engaging your students and supporting candidates to succeed.





Session outlines - officer/student rep stream

10:15 The four student movement roles

This session will introduce you to four key campaign roles, all with their own approach to making change: reformer, rebel, organiser and helper. These roles are a unique way for you to understand your personal contribution to making life better for students and your community. We will identify which role/s you most identify with, their strengths and weaknesses.

11:15 Masterclass sessions: Rebel or Reformer

Having identified your role, masterclasses will be practical sessions to explore one role further. They will help you learn how to play your part most effectively and win for students.

13:00 Masterclass sessions: Organiser or Helper

Having identified your role, masterclasses will be practical sessions to explore one role further. They will help you learn how to play your part most effectively and win for students.

14:15 Connect & Reflect - networking and strategy
